Area of Consideration:	All aviators in the rank of WO1-CW3 or Commissioned Officers, 1LT – CPT, in the branch of 15A, 15B, or 67J. All applicants must possess qualification in MOS 153M or be able to become qualified within 24 months. Applicant must be a member of the VTARNG.

Eligibility Requirements:

- To qualify for initial entry, applicants must meet initial eligibility requirements IAW NGR 600-5 and AR 135-18, Table 2-1.
- In accordance with PPOM 20-023, Execution of Personnel Actions for the Army Combat Fitness Test, para 5h(2), individuals applying for AGR status will require a passing ACFT within 6 months prior to their packet submission.
- Selecting Official will ensure applicants are screened for height/weight prior to the interview board and those not in compliance with AR 600-9, Army Directive 2023-11 (Army Body Fat Assessment for the Army Body Composition Program), and ALARACT 046/2023 (Notification of New Army Body Fat Assessment for the Army Body Compensation Program) or Army Directive 2023-08 (Army Body Fat Assessment Exemption for Army Combat Fitness Test Score), and Army Directive 2023-11 (Army Body Fat Assessment for the Army Body Composition Program), will not be considered. Soldiers with a valid pregnancy profile are exempt from this requirement.
- Before being accessed into the AGR program, Soldiers must successfully complete a physical IAW Chapter 3, AR 40-501. Soldiers must be confirmed worldwide deployable (to include austere environments) with no limitations on duty. Applicants must not be MRC3 or MRC4 or on a temporary profile, with the exception of those applicants who are on a pregnancy/postpartum profile.
- Applicant must be eligible for a "SECRET" Security clearance upon entry into the AGR program. If the investigation is unfavorable, immediate action will be taken to terminate the individual's AGR tour.
- Applicants must not have been previously separated for cause from active duty or a previous Reserve Component AGR tour.
- Applicants who are flagged, or should be flagged, for any reason will not be considered for AGR tours.
- Official start date of this position will be determined by the needs of the organization.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- The purpose of this position is to serve as Training Officer for C Co 3-126 AVN (AA).
- Formulates, establishes, oversees, and evaluates the overall training programs of the command. Develops yearly and longer training plans.
- Issues to subordinate units instruction and procedures needed to conduct training activities so as to meet the requirements of the Department of the Army, National Guard Bureau, Major Army Headquarters and/or higher

headquarters. Provides guidance and assistance to commanders or other training personnel pertaining to scheduling and conduction of training. Reviews training plans and schedules of subordinate units and approves or revises as necessary.

- Schedules and coordinates the use of training sites and facilities. Arranges for equipment and supplies needed for training activities. Procures, or directs the procurement of training aids, manuals or other instructional materials.
- Maintains liaison with personnel at state operated or regular Army operated training sites. Prepares plans and reports pertaining to readiness and mobilization. Receives unit status reports and consolidates into battalion reports.
- Provides guidance and assistance in the preparation of readiness reports. Monitors material readiness reports to determine status of equipment.
- Performs several supervisory functions. Assists in the implementation of provisions of personnel management such as
 equal employment, merit promotion, career development, performance management, counseling services, incentive
 awards etc.
- Assists in the implementation of equipment maintenance. Monitors material readiness reports to determine status of equipment.
- Initials formal request for personnel actions. Plans work schedules and makes assignments to subordinates.
- Manages, monitors and tracks unit preparation for the Aviation Resource Management Survey (ARMS) on behalf of the command. Responsible for the adherence of unit training to the requirements specified in ARMS Training checklist. This includes the documentation and archiving of METL development, short and long range training planning, training management, and the flying hour program in accordance with the ARMS training checklist. Responsible for the documentation and archiving of unit adherence to the requirements specified in ARMS Command Support Programs checklist. These requirements include the hearing conservation, fire prevention, hazards communication, waste management, FOD prevention, drivers training and personal protective equipment programs.
- PERFORMS OTHER DUTIES AS ASSIGNED.

Other Requirements:

- This vacancy is open to eligible Aviators in the rank of WO1 thru CW3 or Commissioned officers in the branch of 15A, 15B, or 67J. All applicants must possess qualification in MOS 153M or be able to become qualified within 24 months.
- Must be able to operate Military vehicles, equipment & office machines within the unit of assignment.
- Must possess a valid state driver's license.
- Must possess or be eligible to possess a Secret Security Clearance if selected.
- Must be intimately familiar with aviation regulations and procedures.
- Must be capable of working with aviation commanders in developing, managing, and maintaining an effective Aircrew Training Program IAW: TC 3-04.11 and TC 3-04.33.
- Will conduct GCSS-A training (G-Track) for Commander's Representative Role for 126th AV units within 30 days of assignment. May be assigned other GCSS-A roles including, but not limited to Access Administrator.
