Area of Consideration:	All Members Of The Vermont Army National Guard And All Those Eligible To Become Members. Applicants must currently hold the grade of E5-E7. Applicants in the grade of E7 must accept an administrative reduction to E6 if selected.
PCS Authorized:	YES (As determined advantageous to the government IAW applicable regulations)

Eligibility Requirements:

- To qualify for initial entry, applicants must meet initial eligibility requirements IAW NGR 600-5 and AR 135-18 Table 2-1. This includes a passing APFT and Height/Weight within 12 months of ad closing date (Current AGR and FTNGD-OS must be within 8 months). Selecting Official will ensure applicants are screened for height/weight prior to the interview board and those not passing will not be considered.
- Before being accessed into the AGR program, Soldiers must successfully complete a Chapter II physical IAW NGVT-HRO-AGR-2014-03, NGR 600-5 and AR 40-501 within 6 months of proposed entry date. Soldiers must be confirmed worldwide deployable (to include austere environments) with no limitations on duty by the AGR office.
- Personnel must be eligible for a "SECRET" Security clearance upon entry into the AGR program. If the investigation is unfavorable, immediate action will be taken to terminate the individual's AGR tour.
- Applicants must have a minimum aptitude score of "93" in area "SC" and "93" in area of "EL" on ASVAB tests administered prior to 01 July 2004 and a minimum aptitude score of "93" in area "EL" and "92" in area "SC" on ASVAB tests administered on or after 01 July 2004. Must also have a physical profile of "111221" for entry into the MOS of 25U.
- Applicants must not have been previously separated for cause from active duty or a previous Reserve Component AGR tour.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- The primary purpose of this position is to serve as the HQ 3-172 IN (MTN) , 86th IBCT (MTN) Signal Support NCO, with additional duties pertaining to Battalion Operations Functions.
- Installs, maintains, and troubleshoots signal support equipment and terminal devices. Installs, operates and maintains designated radio and data distribution systems. Maintains selected electronic devices. Performs signal support functions, to include providing technical assistance and training for user owned and operated automation and communications equipment.
- Provides technical assistance and unit level training for automation, communication, and user owned and operated signal equipment. Disseminates information services policy. Prepares maintenance and supply requests for unit level signal support.
- Plans, supervises, and integrates the installation, operation, and maintenance of Signal Support Systems, to include radio, wire, and battlefield automated systems. Requests maintenance and supply replenishment for Signal support operations.
- Perform local administration of unit automation and assist in planning and integrating computer automation into all facets of BN HQs operations.
- **PERFORMS OTHER DUTIES AS ASSIGNED.**

Other Requirements:

- Applicants who do not hold the 25U MOS must become MOS qualified within 12 months if selected.
- Applicant must be SQI “E” (Mountaineer) qualified or become qualified within 24 months.
- Must possess a valid state driver’s license and must be able to operate military vehicles, equipment, and office machines within the unit of assignment.
- **Applicants who are flagged for any reason will not be considered for AGR tours.**

- Applications without all required supporting documents will not be considered. Applications received after 1600 on the closing date will not be considered. Original packets will not be returned once they are received by the AGR Office.
