Area of Consideration:	All current members of the VTARNG and those eligible to become members. Applicants must be in the rank of 1LT(P) thru CPT.
PCS Authorized:	Yes (As determined advantageous to the government IAW applicable regulations)

Eligibility Requirements:

- To qualify for initial entry, applicants must meet initial eligibility requirements IAW NGR 600-5 and AR 135-18, Table 2-1.
- In accordance with PPOM 22-023, Execution of Personnel Actions for the Army Combat Fitness Test, para 5h(2), individuals applying for AGR status will require a passing ACFT within 6 months prior to their packet submission.
- **All applicants must be screened for height/weight three months prior to the submission of their packet and those not in compliance with AR 600-9, Army Directive 2023-11 (Army Body Fat Assessment for the Army Body Composition Program), and ALARACT 053/2024 (Notification of New Army Body Fat Assessment for the Army Body Compensation Program) or Army Directive 2023-08 (Army Body Fat Assessment Exemption for Army Combat Fitness Test Score) will not be considered. Soldiers with a valid pregnancy profile are exempt from this requirement.**
- Applicant must be eligible for a “SECRET” Security clearance upon entry into the AGR program. If the investigation is unfavorable, immediate action will be taken to terminate the individual’s AGR tour.
- Applicants must not have been previously separated for cause from active duty or a previous Reserve Component AGR tour.
- **Applicants who are flagged, or should be flagged, for any reason will not be considered for AGR tours.**
- Official start date of this position will be determined by the needs of the organization.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- The primary purpose of this position is to serve as the Supervisory Maintenance Test Pilot with the Army Aviation Support Facility with duty in South Burlington, VT.
- Overall responsible for directing and managing the logistics operations and test flying aircraft for the Army Aviation Support Facility (AASF). This position
- Management of the full time AASF maintenance staff, manages logistic plans and programs, and be the organizational authority for all logistics operations and activities for the AASF.
- Coordinates AASF/unit effort to maximize peacetime logistics readiness and wartime preparedness. Aviation logistics experience, and a thorough knowledge of the ARNG structure is essential to the effective accomplishment of duties for this position. Work requirements are driven by AASF operations and training missions, which in turn necessitate coordinated adjustments in priorities and schedules to insure that aircraft are available to fulfill unit missions and alert/national emergency situations, actual or simulated.
- Plans and Programs (10%), Logistics Management (10%), Logistics operations (25%), Maintenance Test Flights (10%), Unit Coordination (10%), Personnel Management (10%), Safety and Quality (5%), Automation (5%), Organizational (15%).
- Supports the Additional Flight Training Program (AFTP).
- Supports unit mobilizations, state and national emergencies, and search and rescue operations as needed.

- Is responsible for the all Logistical, Supply and Maintenance related items relating to the Aviation Resource Management Survey (ARMS) inspection.
- **PERFORMS OTHER DUTIES AS ASSIGNED.**

Other Requirements:

- Must possess a valid state driver's license and must be able to operate military vehicles, and equipment within the unit of assignment.
- Must be qualified in the UH-60M and be a graduate of the Maintenance Officer Course or be able to attend and graduate from the Maintenance Officer Course and become qualified within 24 months.
- Have basic knowledge of computer skills and Microsoft Office applications.
- Must be capable of working with aviation commanders in developing, managing and maintaining an effective Aircrew Training Program IAW: TC 3-04.11 and TC 3-04.33.

Preferred Qualification:

- Qualified in the UH-60M and UH-72A
